# 1. Minutes of last meeting held on 5th September 2017

The minutes of the previous meeting were proposed by Cllr. D. Leahy, seconded by Tom Gallahue and agreed.

### 2. Update on Draft National Planning Framework

Nuala O'Connell, Senior Executive Planner gave a presentation to the Meeting on the Draft National Planning Framework and replied to queries raised. The principal points were as follows:-

#### Ireland in 2040: ERSI Predictions

- 20% increase of 2016 population + 1 million by 2040 = 5.75 million.
- >65 age will double to 1.3 million or 23% of total.
- Half a million new houses required.
- 660,000 new jobs required
- 7 out of 10 households in the state consist of 3 people of less this trend is likely to continue.

#### **New Spatial Structure**

- 5 cities will accommodate 50% of all national growth Dublin, Cork, Galway, Limerick & Waterford
- Northern, Western + Southern Regions combined grow at comparable rates to Eastern and Midland
- Renewal of existing built up areas is the focus 50% in cities / 30% elsewhere
- Large Towns Over 10,000 people Regional Drivers.

- New Definition of Rural
- Target growth of towns and villages by re developing derelict and under-utilised land.

# **New Legislation and Implementation**

NPF will be underpinned by **legislation** and independent **office for Planning Regulation**. **Regional Spatial and Economic Strategies**: follow through to regional and local level Statutory **Metropolitan Area Strategic Planning**: Strategic Plans for five Cities and their surrounds as a whole ("more strategic and co-ordinated planning of our cities and large towns across local authority boundaries")

National Investment Plans – 10 year capital investment plans.

**Key levers** – more comprehensive "Core Strategies", prioritised land zoning to include estimate of service cost, better linked to investment; Active Land Management **National Agency for Active Land Management** to assemble priority urban sites.

A discussion took place concerning related issues including the N24 submission, the fact that Clonmel is the only town in the county with over 10,000 population –members felt the definition of a large town should be reduced to towns of 5,000 population, cap on population will affect planning permissions, concerns re survival of rural Ireland, role of our towns and villages isn't recognised, Tipperary may not feature in the National Investment Plan, FDI may not be attracted to the county, no provision for satellite towns, inadequate rail service in many towns. Tipperary Co. Council's submission will be circulated to the Members and feedback will be welcomed. Submissions to the National Planning Framework must be made by 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2017.
