



PRIVACY NOTICE

Traffic and Pedestrian Survey in connection with road design

The purpose of this privacy notice is to describe, in clear and concise terms, the personal data that the County Council's traffic survey is processing, why it is needed, how it is used and how individuals may interact with the Council in relation to personal data and traffic surveys for road design and construction. It also outlines the rights of individuals under data protection legislation in relation to the processing of their personal data.

Purpose of Tipperary County Council's Traffic Survey

Cameras are being used by a company contracted by Tipperary County Council to carry out a traffic survey between 21 May 2024 and 31 May 2024 to assess the feasibility, need and type of traffic calming and road safety improvement measures that might be required in Ballingarry village. 6 No. Traffic Survey Cameras will be installed as shown on the map below, with one camera for each zone, to capture pedestrian and traffic movement data for a duration of 12 hours from 07:00 to 19:00 during one day between these dates. Installation and collection of the equipment may be in advance of and after this time period respectively.

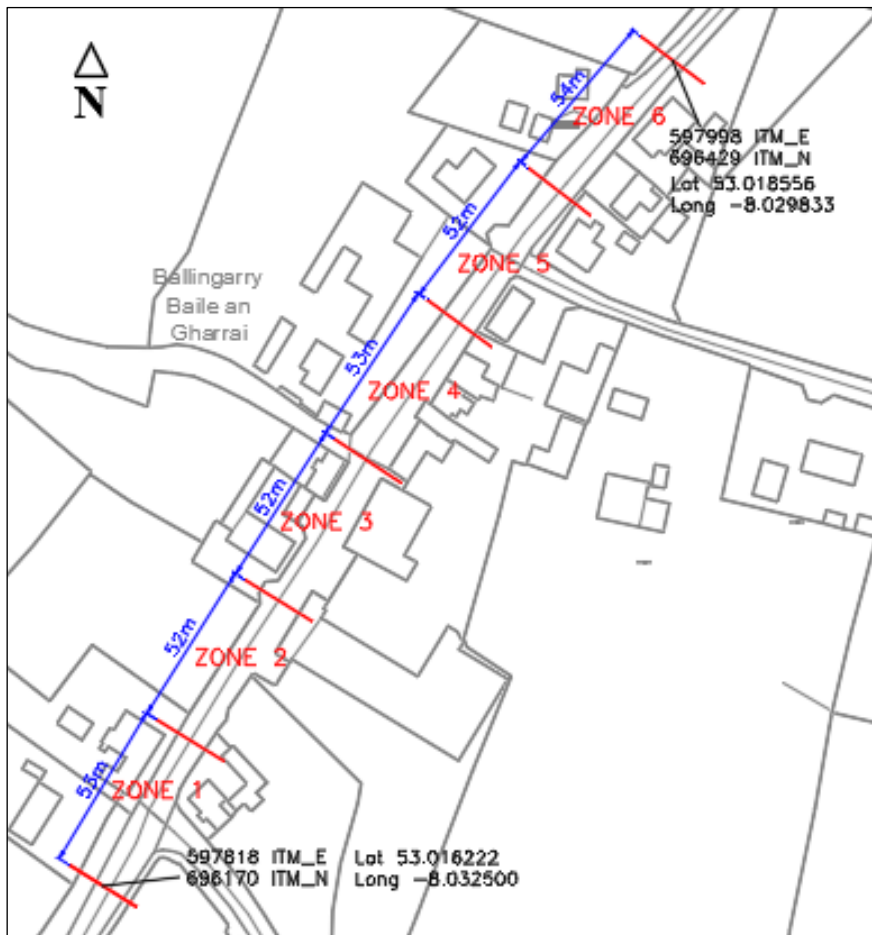


Fig 1 – Traffic and Pedestrian Movement Monitoring Zones

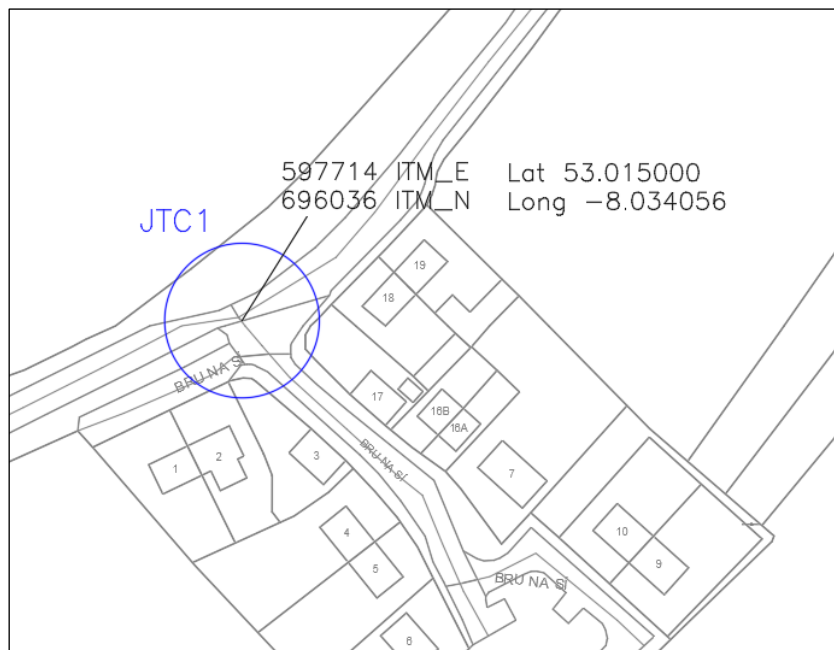


Fig 2 – Junction Turning Count location

An additional Junction Turning Count (JTC) will be installed at the location given in Fig 2 below, again for a duration of 12 hours from 07:00 to 19:00 on the same day as above.

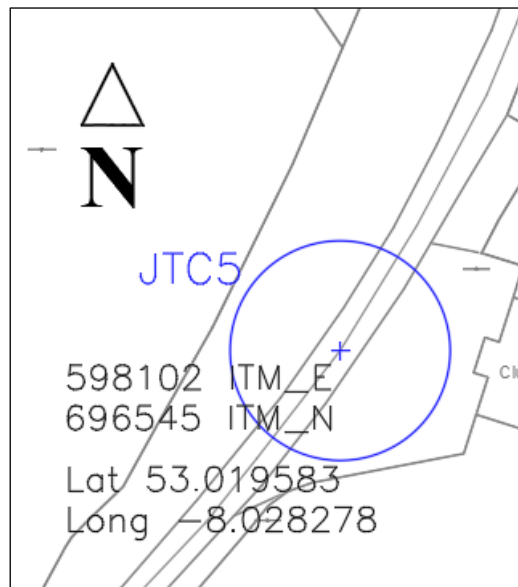


Fig 3 – 7 day JTC at GAA pitch

A JTC camera will be installed to monitor traffic and pedestrian movements to and from the GAA club for a period of 7 days as shown in Fig 3 below.

The 8 No. traffic cameras are deployed in connection with a localised and short-term traffic survey. The cameras will process data in order to:

- Generate anonymized traffic and pedestrian count and movement pattern information to inform possible required road safety measures.

Legal bases for Tipperary County Council's use of traffic cameras for a road survey in connection with road construction

The legal basis for Tipperary County Council's use of CCTV systems to process personal data consists of any one or more of the following:

- Article 6(1) (c) GDPR. The processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which Tipperary County Council is subject:
 - (a) Section 13 - Responsibility of road authorities for the maintenance and construction of public roads and Section 78 - Powers of inspection of the Roads Act 1993:
 - (b) Safety, Health, Safety & Welfare at Work Acts.
- Article 6(1) (e) GDPR
The processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of an official authority vested in Tipperary County Council.

The categories of personal data concerned:

Personal data processed by the camera for traffic survey consist of the following:

- Anonymised (i.e. low resolution) images of vehicles, bicycles and pedestrians will be captured whereby individuals are not recognizable, but the type of traffic (bike, car, truck, pedestrian) can be distinguished.

Processing and recipients of the data

Video footage to classify traffic types/numbers at junctions, including pedestrian movements, and pedestrian crossing activity, will be taken by 8 No. cameras, but at such a resolution and height as to block capacity for personal identification in any image recorded. Personal data is therefore not being gathered from the survey, but rather, anonymized data.

The Council has a data processing agreement in place with the traffic survey company who will act as processor of the data.

The retention period for CCTV data:

No PID information will be provided as part of the survey results therefore there is not a requirement to delete the information within a specified timeframe. The data recorded on the cameras is anonymised data and will be retained by the company for the minimum period so that the necessary detail can be attained to inform the feasibility study. Once this has been completed the data can be securely destroyed.

The right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority.

We may be able to resolve the problem in a timely manner. If you are not satisfied with our response, or if you do not receive a response, at that point you could make a formal complaint to the Data Protection Commission's Office.
